A successful school is one child wide and one child high. Each pupil has a tutor who is at the centre of an extended pastoral team. This includes learning support staff, peer mentors, boarding housemasters, matrons and the school nurse.

When you visit LRGS you will be struck by the warm, family atmosphere that characterises boarding at the school. Our three boarding houses are 'home from home', they are very happy and friendly places.

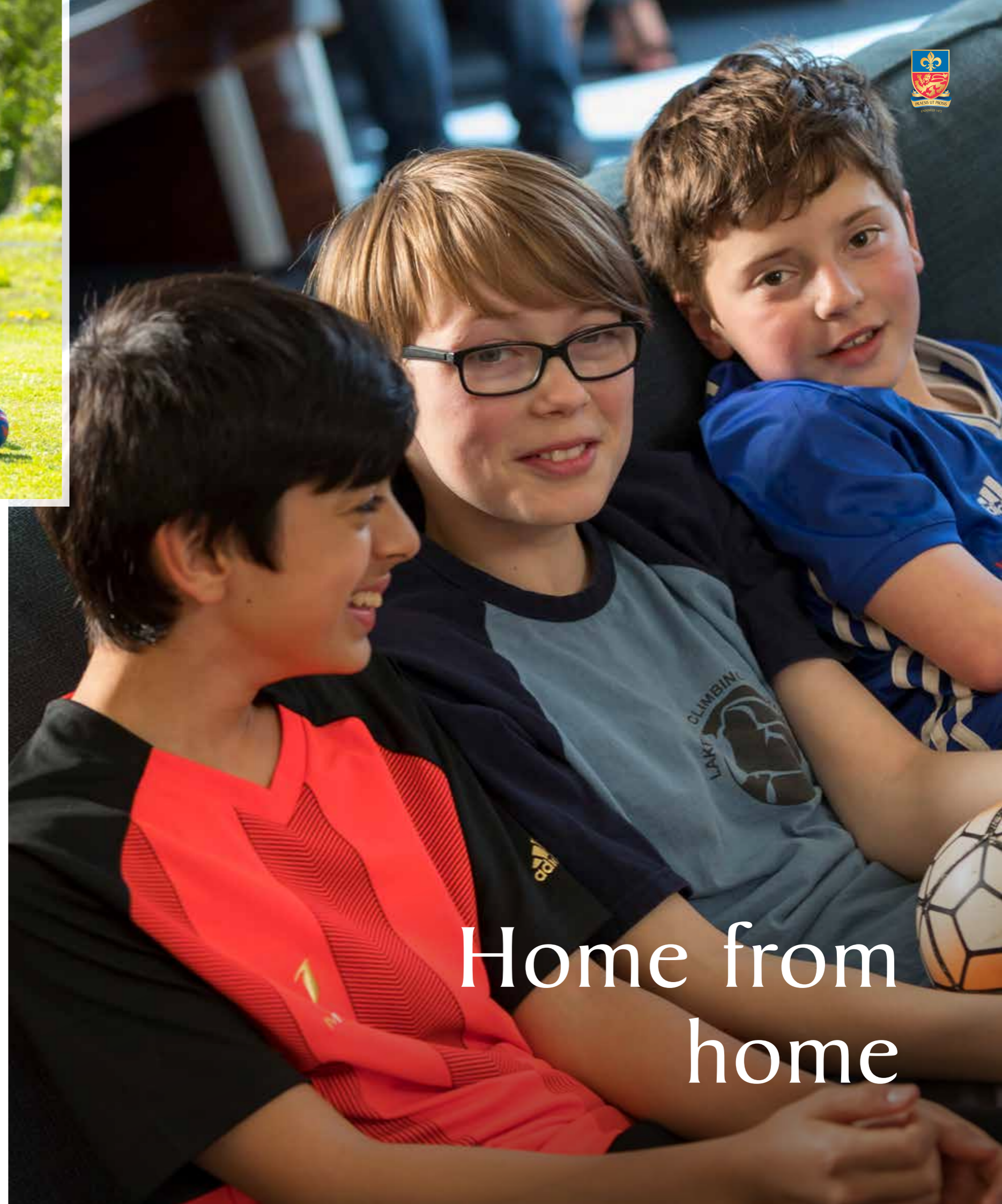
As the excellent education that we provide is free, our fees for boarding are only around one-third of the fees in most independent boarding schools.

Some of our boarders are with us full time; others spend four or five nights at school each week with most weekends at home. This is modern boarding with the flexibility to meet the needs of busy family life. Pupils avoid long daily commutes and are well supported with homework – when they are not busy with friends, after-school activities and weekend trips!

For Sixth Formers, boarding at LRGS is also the best possible springboard to the independence and responsibility of university life.

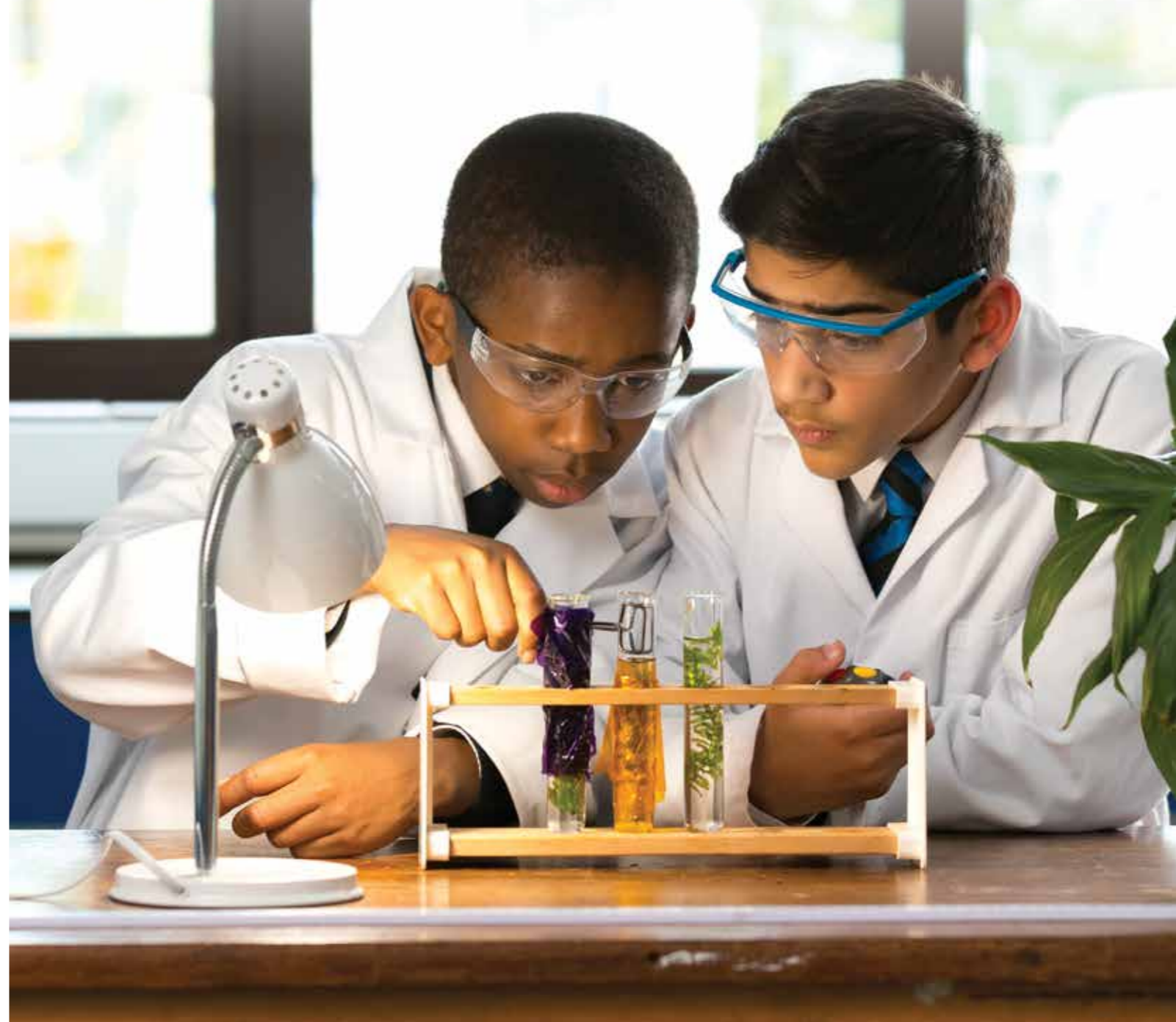

In the Sixth Form, the emphasis is on student achievement and transition to independence. Many students specialise in Arts, Humanities or Sciences; others keep their options more open with a balance of subjects.

Our students achieve impressive examination results, well above all national norms. They go on to achieve success in highly competitive courses, from History and Engineering to Physics and Medicine, at top universities. Every year as many as 10% of our students go to Oxford and Cambridge.

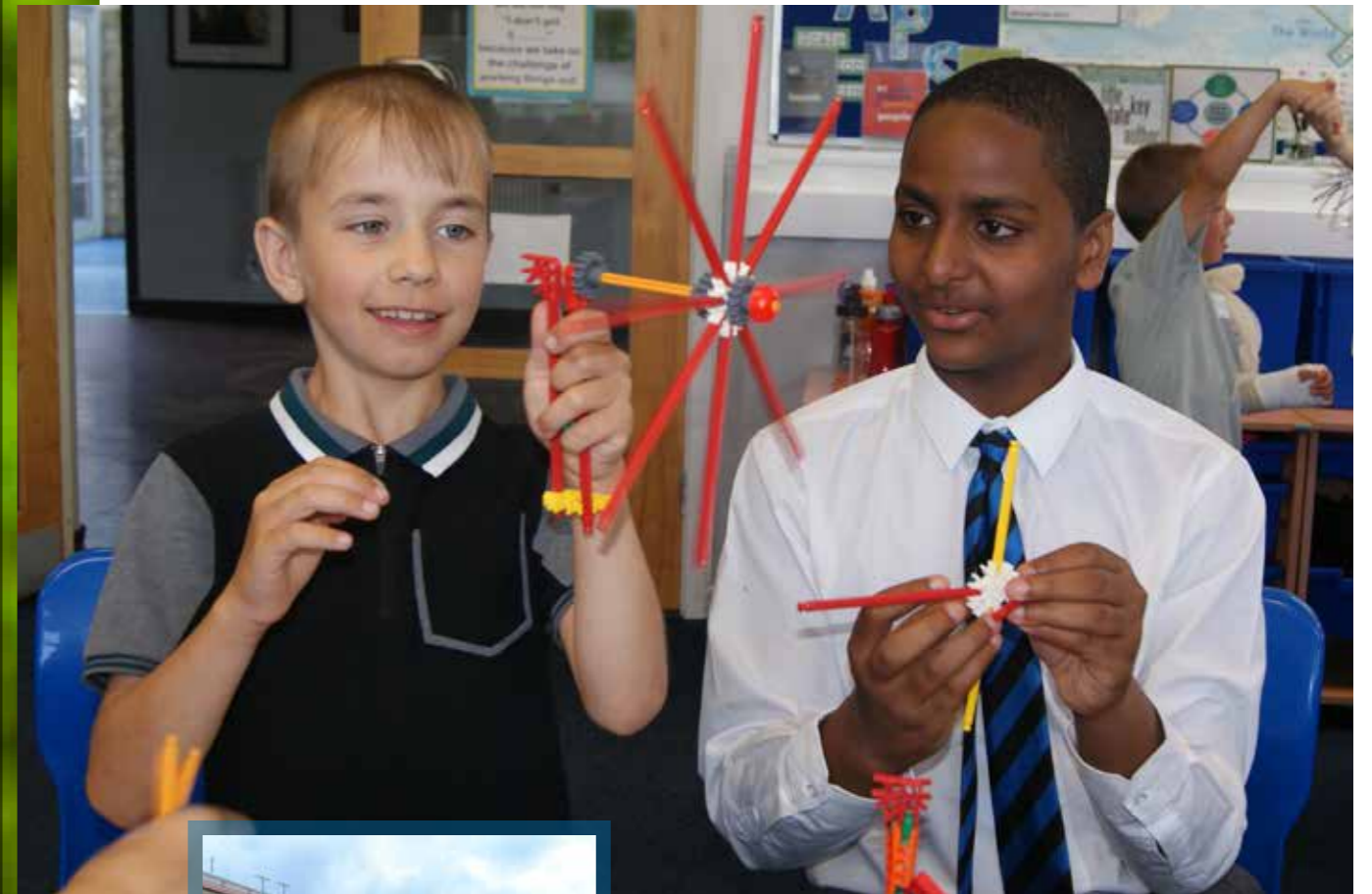

LRGS is an exceptional environment for learning. We are fortunate to be located in a small, friendly university city, close to some of England's most impressive scenery.
